Position: Instructional Assistant Professor

We are looking for an individual to be the Head of the Undergraduate Petroleum Laboratories and Student Programs. A PhD in Petroleum Engineering or allied engineering field is desirable although persons with MS degrees will also be considered. Knowledge and experience in petroleum laboratory instrumentation and equipment is required and industrial experience is highly desired. The person will work closely with students and will be a mentor and advisor in the UG program; hence, they must be interactive and engaging and committed to student learning, development, professionalism, and ultimate career development.
